The Butler Hollow Project
(Abstract Correction)

The Butler Hollow Project – Gating mined caves in Missouri Michael Sutton and Scott House, Cave Research Foundation Presenter: Michael Sutton

The Butler Hollow area on the Mark Twain National Forest (MTNF) in Barry County, Missouri is not an orthodox mining district - the past mining activity is a remarkable story of fraud and naivety involving at least five caves, in a highly unlikely search for radium. The activity left several caves with humanly excavated entrances and passages, which can be hazardous to the public. Because of this past use, the US Forest Service classifies these mostly natural caves as mines, and are obligated to control access for public safety. Since most of the caves house bat populations, bat-friendly gates were required. MTNF entered into a cost-share agreement with Cave Research Foundation to not only gate the mined caves, but to search for other potential mining sites on the Cassville sub-district and to perform mapping and biological survey of caves throughout the sub-district. The project began in 2014. Gating, headed by Jim Cooley, began in October 2015 and was completed in December 2018, with the construction of 12 bat gates on four caves and one mine. The project has also resulted in a thorough documentation of caves throughout the sub-district. Of the 147 known caves, more than 80 were first recorded during this project. Most of the caves are small, but range up to 500 m, and include many biologically and archeologically significant sites.

SURVEY COMPETITION

Think you're a good surveyor? The 2019 National Speleological Society Survey Competition will put your skills to the test. Located in the campground directly adjacent to the cave information booth, the course consists of 12 established stations from which you (teams of up to 3 people) will collect and record data. Either use your own set of instruments (no Disto's!) or check out a compass, clinometer, and tape at the booth (courtesy of Sewanee Mountain Grotto). Loaner instruments are only available while the booth is manned (7-10 AM and 4-7 PM), but the course is open all hours of the day and night from Monday at 8 AM to Thursday noon. Simply pick up a blank data sheet from the "Survey Competition" clipboard at the cave information booth, then get "on station!" Stations are pre-numbered and clearly marked with flagging tape. No sketching required! When you finish, return your data sheet to the box at the booth. Surveys will be judged on accuracy and loop closure, with prizes for the first, second, and third place winners. Winners will be announced 5 PM at the Cave Information Booth at the Fairgrounds Contact Hali Steinmann (halisteinmann@gmail.com) for further information.
