MANAGING REGIONAL CAVE DATA: USING ARCGIS TO WAREHOUSE ARCHIVE DATA

Grand Canyon National Park manages approximately 400 known caves with only an estimated 15 percent of karst in the park explored. Within these caves are incredibly significant mineralogical, biological, archaeological, and paleontological resources. The National Park Service is mandated to manage and protect these resources; however, a good data management system is necessary to do so effectively. Currently, these datasets are managed separately as geospatial, tabular, graphical, and many other data types. We implement a new system that compiles all existing data into one, easier-to-process management system. The goal is to simplify and streamline the system so the large quantity of data, including many different data types, is stored, managed, and retrieved using a single program while also maintaining

functionality. By adding attachments to features in GIS and storing the attachments in a file geodatabase, the documents and files related to the caves are linked to each individual feature. These documents and files are also stored within the same database that contains the cave features and their attributes. Not only does this new method eliminate the need for external storage, all data are stored together. Regardless of where or how the data are accessed, there is no worry about lost connections; all data are always linked and immediately available to the user. This new method of data storage and access in ArcGIS greatly improves upon the current database model and is applicable to all large database and archival systems.

SURVEY COMPETITION

Think you're a good surveyor? The 2019 National Speleological Society Survey Competition will put your skills to the test. Located in the campground directly adjacent to the cave information booth, the course consists of 12 established stations from which you (teams of up to 3 people) will collect and record data. Either use your own set of instruments (no Disto's!) or check out a compass, clinometer, and tape at the booth (courtesy of Sewanee Mountain Grotto). Loaner instruments are only available while the booth is manned (7-10 AM and 4-7 PM), but the course is open all hours of the day and night from Monday at 8 AM to Thursday noon. Simply pick up a blank data sheet from the "Survey Competition" clipboard at the cave information booth, then get "on station!" Stations are pre-numbered and clearly marked with flagging tape. No sketching required! When you finish, return your data sheet to the box at the booth. Surveys will be judged on accuracy and loop closure, with prizes for the first, second, and third place winners.
